ABOUT THE POSITION

The Field Course Assistant will join our instructional staff in organizing and running backpacking journeys for youth in the Rocky Mountains.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assist in field course preparation and logistics.
- Assist in organizing, repairing and maintaining course equipment.
- Participate in pre-course planning including debriefs, route planning, and curriculum planning.
- Travel with a wilderness hiking field course on one or multiple 5-21 day expeditions.
- Assist the course instructors with aspects of field travel including:
 - camp skills lessons
 - pace setting
 - route finding
 - monitoring participant physical health and safety
 - monitoring participant emotional health and safety
 - coordinating morning and evening meetings
 - running games and activities
 - curriculum delivery
 - camp infrastructure setup and takedown
- Provide extra support and assistance for course participants as needed.
- Share local cultural beliefs and historical knowledge with participants.
- Assist in creating a positive group culture and ensuring that participants from diverse backgrounds are welcomed into the group.
- Assist instructors in teaching respect and appreciation for the environment, ecological knowledge, and leave-no-trace camping skills.
- Assist in field course wrap-up including gear cleaning and repair, debriefs and paperwork.



- Develop knowledge of the adventure tourism industry and outdoor education.
- Assist in generating ideas and developing plans to improve and expand program offerings.
- Adhere to all OBC policies and guidelines, and applicable legislation as related to staff and volunteer practices.
- Assist with other logistical and administrative course details in the branch as needed.

SKILLS AND EXPERIENCE DESIRED

- Significant personal experience with multi-day backpacking trips, obtained through work or personal experience. Experience on trips longer than 7 days is an asset.
- Experience working with youth and confidence in maintaining positive professional relationships with students.
- Flexible schedule and ability to maintain self-care and contribute to the group in a challenging outdoor environment.
- Positive attitude, strong work ethic, and good organizational skills.
- Experience with outdoor gear repair is an asset.
