Outward Bound Canada offers scholarships for youth who identify as Black, Indigenous (First Nations, Métis or Inuit) or as a Person of Colour, who demonstrate an interest in developing their leadership skills, in efforts to positively impact and give back to their community. We strive to provide programs across the country that offer a supportive and inclusive environment from diverse social, cultural and economic backgrounds, and for those facing a variety of barriers to getting outdoors. Our mission is to cultivate resilience, leadership, connections and compassion through inspiring and challenging journeys of discovery in the natural world. Our vision is for a healthy, resilient society formed through lasting connections to self, others and the natural world. Our full scholarships are made possible by our generous donors like the RBC Foundation.

Eligibility Requirements

- Applicant must be between 15 - 19 years of age and currently residing in Canada.
- Applicant must demonstrate their desire to continue building their leadership capacity.
- Applicant must understand the expectations of the program and provide informed consent.
- Applicant must be interested and motivated to participate in the Outward Bound program.



How to Apply

1. Apply online during the registration process when you sign up for your course and complete all required forms. Alternatively, you can complete the attached package by sending it back to us by email or fax. If you need further assistance to complete the application, please email or call us to discuss other options.
2. You may be requested to provide additional information or documentation, and both the applicant and parent/guardian will be asked to participate in a phone call to learn more about the program.
3. You will receive notification of being awarded the scholarship by email. You will be requested to sign a Funding Agreement to confirm your commitment. If your application is not approved, you will have the option to stay in the course and pay the full balance or switch courses.
